



Contract Review

Construction projects are complex and multi-faceted. Likewise, the law governing construction is complex and multi-faceted. Aside from questions of what one *can* do in construction, it also illuminates the question of what one *may* do – that is to say, what the law of construction allows. Contracts are the threads from which the fabric of commerce is woven. A contract may be as simple as an agreement to pay for food ordered in a restaurant, or so complicated that no legion of lawyers could decipher the real intent, or somewhere in between.
